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GUIDELINE B

SIGNATURES OF STUDENTS AND TITLES FOR PERSONS CLAIMING EXEMPTION

THE PURPOSE OF THIS DOCUMENT IS TO DESCRIBE APPROPRIATE (1) SIGNATURES OF STUDENTS AND (2) TITLES FOR PERSONS CLAIMING EXEMPTION FROM LICENSURE PURSUANT TO SECTIONS 4759.10 (B) & (E) OF THE OHIO REVISED CODE.

(1) SIGNATURES OF STUDENTS

Please be advised that the suggested signatures are for student status and not intended as titles for job classifications or positions.

Student Dietitian: This is the signature for a student only while engaging in practice which is part of the academic or pre-professional experience of an approved ADA program, and under appropriate supervision of a dietitian.

Dietetic Intern: This is the appropriate signature for a dietetic intern only while engaging in practice which is part of an approved ADA internship program and under appropriate supervision of a dietitian.

Student Dietetic Technician: This is the signature for a student only while engaging in practice which is part of an approved ADA dietetics technician program, under appropriate supervision of a dietitian .

(2) TITLES FOR PERSONS CLAIMING EXEMPTION

Dietetic Technician (DT): This is the appropriate title for one who has a 2 year associate degree in dietetic technology from a program approved by the American Dietetic Association and is exempted from licensure to practice dietetics under the supervision of a licensed dietitian or registered dietitian pursuant to Section 4759.10 (B) of the Ohio Revised Code.

Registered Dietetic Technician (DTR): This is the appropriate title for one who has a 2 year associate degree in dietetic technology from a program approved by the American Dietetic Association, is registered with the Commission on Dietetic Registration, and is exempted from licensure to practice dietetics under the supervision of a licensed dietitian or registered dietitian pursuant to Section 4759.10 (B) of the Ohio Revised Code.

Nutrition Associate or Nutrition Care Technician: These titles have been suggested for a person who has completed a baccalaureate or higher degree meeting the academic standards set by the American Dietetic Association, who is exempted from licensure to practice dietetics and works under the supervision of a dietitian pursuant to Section 4759.10 (E) of the Ohio Revised Code.

This document is only a guideline and should not be interpreted as all inclusive or exclusive. Violations reported to the Board will be reviewed on a case by case basis.
